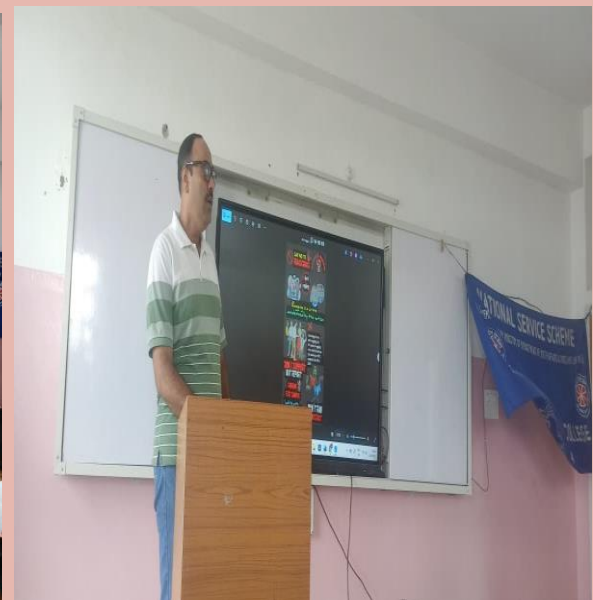

## **MAJOR CRIMES IN INDIA: A GLIMPSE OF THE LAST FIVE YEARS -**

In the last five years(2020-2025), India has witnessed several shocking crimes that have not only shaken the conscience of the nation but also raised urgent concerns about safety, justice and governance. These incidents highlight that crime in India is not limited to any one category; rather, it spans across gender-based violence, cyber fraud and even crimes committed by those in positions of authority.

One of the most horrifying cases was the 2025 Varanasi gang-rape, where a young woman was brutally assaulted by multiple men, once again exposing the grave reality of women's vulnerability even in urban areas. Similarly, the 2024 Kolkata doctor's rape and murder inside a medical college stunned the country, showing that even professional spaces assumed to be secure can turn into sites of violence. These cases underline the persistent challenge of gender-based crimes in India.

Equally disturbing was the 2023 Jaipur Express killings, carried out by a Railway Protection Force constable, which demonstrated how those entrusted with protecting lives can misuse power in the most tragic manner. The Bhiwani killings in Haryana, linked to cow vigilantism, reflected the rising dangers of mob violence and intolerance in society. Together, these cases serve as grim reminders of how law and order are often undermined by deep-rooted social issues.

Apart from these cases, crimes against women, economic offences, cyber frauds, and murders remain widespread across the country. The rapid spread of technology has further given rise to cybercrime, affecting thousands of ordinary citizens financially and psychologically.

As India continues to grow on the global stage, ensuring safety and justice for its people is essential for building a nation that is not only economically strong but also socially just and secure.
