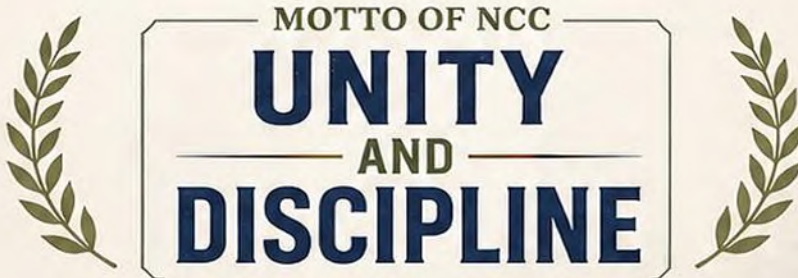

However, since NCC required a commitment of 3 years, first year students were given more importance all the first year boys and girls were especially enthusiastic about becoming a part of NCC but getting a part of NCC is not easy it feel like preparing for recruitment into armed forces. No one was elected without proper testing. First the height of the students was measured.

At the hospital, all the cadets underwent a detailed medical checkup, which took the entire day. The examination include x-ray, eye checkup, blood test and other necessary medical test.
